The workshops will be devoted to short talks on immune memory from the immunological and epidemiological perspectives. The workshop will focus on lessons learned from vaccines and from studies of paradigmatic infections (influenza, measles, pertussis). This will be followed by discussions on the mechanistic basis of immune memory and a discussion of what we can learn from persistent infections. We will wrap up with a forward-looking discussion of avenues for further progress and collaborations.
